Day 2 Alexandra – Merton & return (approx 65km)

How do we get to the start Own transport, or coach

Is there a safe place to leave vehicles Yes. Parking is available near the start of the trail around the

Rotary Park.

Is it a race No. The ride will not be timed.

What time do we start The first wave will leave at 8.00am from Alexandra, the last

wave will leave at 10.00am.

Will there be a briefing before the start Yes. First at 7.45 and a second at 9.00am.

Where do we ride on Day 1 Alexandra - Merton- Alexandra Where do we ride on day 2 Alexandra - Yea - Alexandra

Do we have to register Yes, Register Now

Can we register as a team, family or single

Yes - individual and team entries are available

Do we all start together or is there a

staggered start

Start is any time between 8.00am – 10.00am

When does the ride finish We ask that riders be off the trail and back in Alexandra by

5.00pm on Saturday to attend the function

What does it cost Registration is \$50, fundraising \$250 To find a cure for cancer Why are we riding Do I have to do any fundraising Yes minimum amount \$250 What are the options for fundraising We will provide raffle tickets with prizes, all you have to do is sell the tickets, or set up a social media fundraising page, or just make a donation. It's your choice. Where do I get the raffle tickets from? We will mail them out following registration What sort of bikes are suitable for the riding Mountain, hybrid or commuter bikes – the surface is surface described as fine gravel and is not suited to the narrow tyres of road bikes Are any meals provided? Morning tea and afternoon tea Are there any first aid facilities on the ride? Team captain should carry basic first aid, marshals will have two way radios for emergencies Are there amenities along the way Yes – see attached maps. The trail passes through small towns where toilets, water and cafes are available Will there be any drink stops provided Morning and afternoon tea. Alexandra What activities are scheduled for Saturday Jersey awards and presentations evening in Alexandra Will I get a jersey or t-shirt for the ride, if so A Tour de Trails training t-shirt will be provided in Alexandra where and when do we collect them and can be collected on Friday night or Saturday morning What happens if it rains We get wet What is the refund policy Registration and fundraising are non refundable. Notification of special circumstances up to 2 weeks prior to start will be considered by the organising committee. What happens if there is a serious bushfire The event may be cancelled at the organisers discretion in warning in the area consultation with the regional emergency services. If the ride is out and back is there a time for Allow time to explore the area in Yea. There is no set time for the return ride to start the return however we ask that you are off the trail and back in Alexandra by 5pm on Saturday to attend our function.

No. This is a ride for all ages and abilities. You can turn back

at any time if you need to cut the ride short.

Are there any age limits?

Is there any bike mechanics with spares on the ride

We will have roving marshals that will have some spares and mechanical ability. We expect that you will bring your own spares due to the many varied types of bikes.

Do I need to book my own accommodation in Alexandra

Yes. Accommodation in Alexandra is limited so please book early. We have chosen a quiet weekend but we hope to fill the town with Tour de Trails riders and supporters.

Is lunch available in Yea and Merton

Yes. Yea has a lot of options. There is only a Caltex Service Station in Merton so we advise you to stop in Yarck. There are a couple of great bakeries. See website for options.
